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
### **Recall Messages**

#### **Health Checks**

If you're aged 40 to 74 and do not have a pre-existing health condition, you should be invited to an NHS Health Check by your GP or local council every 5 years. We have currently paused invites for these but will resume in September.

If you think you are eligible but have not been invited, contact your GP surgery to find out if they offer NHS Health Checks or contact your local council to find out where you can get an NHS Health Check in your area.

The check is for people who are aged 40 to 74 who do not have any of the following pre-existing conditions:

- Heart disease
- Chronic kidney disease
- Diabetes
- High blood pressure (hypertension)
- Atrial fibrillation
- Transient ischaemic attack

- Inherited high cholesterol (familial hypercholesterolemia)
- Heart failure
- Peripheral arterial disease
- Stroke
- Currently being prescribed statins to lower cholesterol

Previous checks have found that you have a 20% or higher risk of getting cardiovascular disease over the next 10 years



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#### **Private Covid Vaccinations**

Abbey Medical Centre has started offering private Covid vaccinations for patients who wouldn't otherwise be eligible for a free vaccination on the NHS.

We are offering this private service for £89. Text messages are being sent out to patients who the service may be of interest to or benefit from.



## Looking ahead to Flu and vaccinations

Although we are in the summer, we are already looking ahead to autumn and the start of the flu season, in our next newsletter we will expand on the progress and plan for vaccinations in greater detail.

Our annual Flu programme will commence in September, this will be followed by Covid vaccinations starting up again in October, as well as a new vaccination which is featured below.

### Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV) vaccination

From 1 September 2024, an RSV vaccine should be offered to:

- Adults turning 75 years old on or after 1 September 2024, who remain eligible until their 80th birthday
- Adults already aged 75 to 79 years on 1st September 2024 as a catch up cohort
- All pregnant women should be offered the RSV vaccination from week 28 of their pregnancy.

#### What is RSV?

Respiratory syncytial virus is a common cause of acute respiratory tract infections which are usually mild and self-limiting. The virus is transmitted via respiratory droplets (coughing, sneezing), through close contact with an infected person or contact with contaminated surfaces. Symptoms usually include runny nose, cough and fever. For infants, and older adults, the virus can lead to more severe illness and hospitalisation.

#### What does a BMS Specialist mean?

A menopause specialist is a healthcare professional who has additional knowledge and skills, assessing and treating women with complex needs such as multiple treatment failures, POI, complex medical problems, high risk cancer genes or hormone dependant cancer. They accept referrals of more complex patients and support colleagues to manage patients with higher risk factors or where there are multiple factors that affect decision making.

Abbey Medical Centre has benefited from gaining a superb display, which is regularly watered by two volunteers of the PPG. The combined efforts have resulted in an increase in wildlife activity, especially the bees which can be seen picking up their pollen bounty!





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# Carers' Project

We have introduced a new Wellbeing service at the surgery focusing on carers. Our team of trained non-medical staff have been making regular calls to registered carers whom may need our support.

The goal is to offer a more Pro-active service, as it stands we are already liaising with another practice who aim to mirror this innovative initiative. The service is predominantly aimed at the health and wellbeing of the carer, but may also incorporate issues faced by the person being cared for.

The volunteers undertaking this project have previously been involved with a similar wellbeing project whereby they made contact with patients over 70 who haven't visited the GP's in the past 6 months to check in and see how things are going and if they may need any signposting to additional services. This Project went very successfully and set the course for the current carers project.
